We thank those who have participated in the past and encourage everyone to use the list of suggested items that can be picked up in the church lobby each month to help with purchasing items that are needed.

Gifts for Jesus – 2021: Celebrating the Birthday of Jesus

This year there are three opportunities for sharing with others.

- 1. UMCOR Disaster Response to help many areas recover from Wildfire and Flood Disaster This is through the United Methodist church, thus 100% of the money collected is used for this project.
- 2. Gift Bags for Female Inmates at the Lebanon County Correctional Facility **Note:** Due to Covid, gift bags cannot be taken into the facility. However, a \$10 donation will provide for the items purchased by LCCF team members; thus, the inmates will still get a gift bag (thermal undershirt, shampoo, deodorant, and a pair of white socks).
- 3. Lebanon County Christian Ministries Due to Covid, there are many families tapping into their services. As we count down the days to the birth of Jesus, each week listed items will be collected in the church narthex.
- November 28 Laundry detergent, cleaning supplies, paper towels, toilet paper, diapers (Size 4, 5, or 6)
- December 5 Canned meats (spam, chicken, Dinty Moore) Instant mashed potatoes, canned chili, etc.
- December 12 Plastic jars of 18 oz. Peanut Butter and 12-18 oz. Grape Jelly, Cereals, Complete Pancake mix
- December 19 Soups, Canned Fruits, Canned Pasta (SpaghettiOs, Ravioli)

Please make checks payable to Mount Gretna United Methodist Church. Note: UMCOR and/or Gift Bags on the check. Let us respond to Christ's command to feed the hungry, care for the sick, comfort the heartbroken and welcome the stranger in our midst.

Disability Ministry Update 2021

During the final quarter of 2021, the Mt. Gretna UMC Disability Ministry distributed three awards. The recipients were: Susquehanna Service Dogs, Quest Inc., and Lebanon Vision Corps.

I received a very heartfelt thank you card from Jeff Veasley, recipient of an award from Lebanon Vision Corps. The card is addressed to me but is collectively intended for the entire congregation. The award of forty-five dollars was the lowest award amount to date but garnered one of the most heartfelt expressions of appreciativeness. The award was used to purchase Jeff a new white cane that is also collapsible, which makes it more manageable to store when not being used. The ministry offered to purchase Jeff a white cane of higher quality compared to his previous model. He told us that was not necessary. Jeff stated the singular and most important feature of a cane for him is the grip and how it fits his hand to manipulate it most efficiently.

The message in the first sentence of Jeff's card, "You are a blessing because God gave you that ministry." Sometimes it takes a complete stranger to make the obvious plain. God did indeed lead me to the disability ministry, helped me recognize the need, directed me, and prompted my inquiry about the possibility of establishing a disability ministry. God also directed each individual person serving on the committee that granted the approval to establish and fund the ministry.

In addition, I want to publicly thank all the members of the Endowment Committee for making the disability ministry a reality since 2020. Moreover, approving the grant requests submitted for the funding required to fulfill all outreach ministries within our community.

Finally, the disability ministry is looking forward to forming a new partnership with Developmental Disability Services (DDS), Lebanon, Pa. The ministry anticipates providing one to three scholarships, which will be used to send disabled children who are their clients to a weeklong daytime summer camp.
