Home from School: The Children of Carlisle

The Eastern PA Conference Committee on Native American Ministries has made available this documentary about Native children who were taken from their communities and sent to the Carlisle (Pa.) Indian School in the late 1800s for 'Americanization.' As many as 10,000 children from more than 140 tribes were sent to the school during its 39 years of operation. While some students thrived, others did not survive.
